Program and is co-sponsored by the University of Pittsburgh Press. The first two articles are entitled "Lack of association between IRF6 polymorphisms and non-syndromic oral clefts in South Indian population" and "Non-syndromic oral clefts and risk of cancer: a systematic review."
