☐ <u>File your FAFSA</u> - Parental information is <u>not</u> required as graduate students are considered independent. <u>Pitt Dental's School Code is E00750</u> . Deadline for filing the FAFSA is March 28, 2025. Any FAFSA filed after the deadline may delay your financial aid offer. The student will be responsible for any late fees incurred on their student account in this situation.
□ Complete the Pitt Dental Financial Aid Application and return it by the deadline of
March 28th – First time applicants must complete the Financial Aid Application. Applicants renewing their financial aid DO NOT have to complete the application. Be sure to follow the instructions carefully. If you are applying for the Health Professions Loan you will need to have your parents complete the Supplemental Application, SIGN it, and include a copy of their 2023 SIGNED Federal tax return. Income guidelines for HPL loan are parental AGI of \$90,000 or less.
☐ Complete your Entrance Counseling – FOR ALL FIRST-TIME Pitt Dental Students
BORROWERS , you must complete online Entrance Counseling for Direct Loan/ Graduate PLUS loans even if you have completed this process for another school.
☐ Complete your Master Promissory Note (MPN) - FOR ALL FIRST-TIME LOAN BORROWERS, you must complete the MPN online for the Unsubsidized Loan and Graduate PLUS loans (if participating in this program). Both MPNs are accessible at the same site.
□ <u>Accept your Financial Aid Offer</u> — Aid offers will be sent via email in late May or early June after cost of attendance budgets have been determined.

• If your award letter lists a HPL loan, you will receive instructions under separate cover from Heartland/ECSI regarding electronically signing your promissory note and any other paperwork that they require.
